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THE APOSTLE CLOTET, STRONG ADVOCATE OF THE INTERIOR LIFE

ar from the discreet role he usually occupies in the life of the Congregation, the Clotet Year has made the figure of Fr. Jaime very present in the Claretian life in recent months.

Embracing his vocation from his own personal identity, Jaime Clotet was a man of deep introspection, shy but not timid, conscientious in his obligations, tireless worker, observer, attentive to his inner motions as well as to people, and very realistic in the hard circumstances he had to live: exile, poverty, misunderstandings, etc.

St. John Paul II underlined his most profound contribution to the Claretian life when he declared him Venerable: "His mission in the Institute can be summarized as follows: firm defender of the interior life in an intensely apostolic Institute". Clotet, without ever ceasing to feel like a missionary, emphasized the contemplative side of the Claretian life, inseparable from the apostolic, but often not so well cared for.

Clotet is remembered as a kind and welcoming person, an irreplaceable formator of the first generations of missionary Brothers. Those who study about him affirm that it is necessary to qualify with rigor some affirmations that have been generalized about his propensity towards scruples or his more monastic



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
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
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than apostolic influence, aspects that should be rethought in the light of his deep love for the Founder, of whom he was the chronicler, and for the Congregation, for which he gave himself for many years.

Fr. Clotet continues to be admired as a pioneer in the work with the hearing impaired, something that should be further explored. Fr. Manuel Segura CMF, of the Province of Fatima, who published his dissertation in 1986, helped in this regard. A group of specialists in Catalan sign language (LSC) continues to insist on this today. Clotet showed his ingeniousness by learning LSC himself and then codifying it for the first time in a syntax and publishing it. He dedicated himself to deaf children who did not attend school - the poorest of the poor. His teachings are still very much alive today.

Clotet was not content with catechizing the deaf, but also devoted himself to their advancement and help. Eustaquio Belloso CMF, one of his brothers in the community, speaks of this: "(...) when they were sick, he visited them and tried to do what he could for them. One of them, named José Serra, his married sister did not want him in her house unless he brought his bed and clothes and earned enough to sustain himself. Father [Clotet] provided him with a bed and clothes, and told me to teach him how to sew. Within a few days, José knew how to make pants. Clotet then placed him in a tailor's shop he trusted, where he learned a great deal". Neither Clotet nor Belloso used the term SOMI, but it seems that they understood very well what today we call "solidarity and mission".





CONCLUSION OF THE CLOTET YEAR

The celebration of the Clotet Year ended on February 4, 2023, with the celebration of the Eucharist presided over by Fr. Carlos Sanchez, CMF, General Prefect of Spirituality and Community Life, in the sanctuary-parish Cor de Maria in Barcelon (Spain), where the remains of Venerable Jaime Clotet rest. Fr. Juan Martín Askaiturrieta, CMF, Provincial of Sanctus Paulus, spoke at the end of the celebration.



Before the Mass, in collaboration with the diocesan secretariat of pastoral care of persons with disabilities and the Casal dels Sords of Barcelona, the Claretians of Sanctus Paulus organized a conference in which Fr. Juan Carlos Martos, CMF, director of the Claret Spirituality Center of Vic (CESC), spoke about "approaching the person of Fr. Jaime Clotet, Claretian and educator of deaf children in Vic". Mr. Xavier Moral, responsible for Catalan Sign Language of the Generalitat de Catalunya, spoke on "Jaume Clotet, discoverer and designer of the Catalan Sign Language".

GOD-CENTERED AND MISSION-DRIVEN: CIRCULAR LETTER ON FR. CLOTET

On the occasion of the Bicentenary of the birth of our cofounder, Fr. Jaime Clotet, Father General released a Circular titled "God-centered and mission-driven. A reflection at the closing of Clotet Year." It reviews Fr. Clotet's life and spiritual heritage and invites all Congregation members to reflect on his legacy.

"Jaime Clotet (1822-1898), the youngest of our co-founders, to whom the Congregation has wished to pay a well-deserved tribute. We have done so by recalling with fraternal joy the life and spiritual heritage of our brother through a handful of activities in keeping with his personality and style: simple and profound, without offending the modesty of one who never abandoned a fruitful second place in our Institute."

Father General encouraged those who may not be familiar with Fr. Clotet's story to take the opportunity to discover his legacy and explore his greatness as we close "Clotet Year." The circular closed with an invitation to continue walking as missionaries, inspired by Fr. Clotet's example.

In a world of so much focus on individual success and personal gain, it can be easy to forget the importance of serving others. However, one organization in South Korea is working to change that. Youth Mungan, a social organization founded by Fr. Gabriel Lee, CMF of Kore Independent Delegation, is a shining example of selfless service for all. It aims to provide leisure and relaxation for the country's young people's bodies, minds, and souls.

The organization was born out of a desire to help young people in need, following a heart-moving experience shared by a religious sister with Fr. Gabriel. The sister had seen a news report of a young student living in a rented room in Seoul who had passed away from hunger due to chronic disease. This tragic event inspired Fr. Gabriel to take action and create an organization that could provide affordable meals to young people who were struggling financially.

Youth Mungan serves a single, affordable meal to all young people, regardless of their financial situation, with no standards attached. This act of compassion and generosity reflects the organization's core values of serving and helping others, rooted in the religious belief of selfless service and charity. Like any other mission, it had its struggles. But one's people came to know the relevance of it in a developed city; they extended their hearts and hands.

The organization's mission is not limited to providing meals, it also provides a variety of other activities for young people, including distributing briquettes in winter to the elderly, a "Supporter of Environment" program, and a "Generations Can Relate" program that aims to bridge the gap between the old and the young. The organization also recently joined the "Youth Hope Road" program, which aims to accompany and support young people.

Youth Mungan's ultimate goal is to feed, accompany, shelter, and guide young people with hope, care, and love. This selfless service inspires all, regardless of religious beliefs, as it teaches us the importance of helping others and positively impacting the world.

The organization has received numerous awards and contributions from the country and the church in South Korea, a testament to its positive impact on society. The organization also hosts a "Youth Film Festival" to encourage young filmmakers, and plans to open a new branch on Jeju Island.

Youth Mungan is a shining example of how religious values and beliefs can be translated into action, and how even the smallest acts of kindness can make a big difference in the lives of others. It is a powerful reminder that we all can positively impact the world, regardless of our beliefs or backgrounds.

SPIRITUALITY CONGRESS ONGOING PREPARATIONS

Rome, Italy. The Spirituality Congress preparatory commission met for the second time on January 13-14 at the General Curia to further plan the event. Besides the framework set by the General Government, they reflected and discussed new ways of celebrating this important event to ensure greater participation and involvement of the whole Congregation. Cardinal Aquilino Bocos, CMF, generously offered valuable insights on how to celebrate it. Likewise, the two-day meeting also discussed organizational and logistical concerns and drew concrete proposals to present to the General Government for approval.

The Spirituality Congress is part of the activities to celebrate the 175th Foundation Anniversary of the Congregation in 2024. The General Government created a preparatory commission headed by the General Prefect of Spirituality and Community Life, Fr. Carlos Sanchez Miranda, CMF. The members are Frs. Juan Carlos Martos, CMF (CESC Director), Gonzalo Fernández, CMF (Publicaciones Claretianas Director), Anthony Igbokwe, CMF (Santiago Province Prefect of Spirituality), Edgardo Guzmán, CMF (Superior of Claretianum), and Efren Limpo Lo, CMF (Secretary General).

Quezon City, Philippines. The Institute for Consecrated Life in Asia (ICLA) celebrated Religious Life Week 2023 on January 20-22 with the theme People of God Walking Together: Synodality in the Life and Mission of the Church. The highlights of this year's event were the talks on The Role of Canon Law in a Synodal Church by Fr. Elias L. Ayuban, Jr., CMF, JCD, Provincial Superior of Fr. Rhoel Gallardo Province and Co-Chairperson of the Conference of Major Superiors of the Philippines; Synodality in the Dominican Spirituality and Tradition by Fr. Rodel E. Aligan, OP, SThD, a Dominican theologian and the Dean of Faculty of Sacred Theology at Santo Tomas University; and The Practice of Synodality in Consecrated Life by Sr. Mary John Mananzan, OSB, PhD, an educator, and feminist-activist

ICLA's celebration of Religious Life Week this year, after more than two years of restrictions due to the pandemic, has become even more meaningful with the presence of hundreds of religious men and women and lay partners who longed to be enlightened on the role of each one in the life and mission of Church.

Bangalore, India. A National Seminar on Forever Yours: Fidelity and Perseverance in Consecrated Life based on the document *The Gift of Fidelity and the Joy of Perseverance* took place from January 28 to 29 at the Sanyasa Institute of Consecrated Life (ICL) bringing together religious leaders, scholars, and members of the consecrated life to discuss and explore themes of fidelity and perseverance in their vocation. Fr. Gonzalo Fernandez Sanz, CMF, gave the keynote address followed by the launch of the book *A Birthing: When Grace Meets Nature* by Fr. Paulson Veliyannoor, CMF.

Then, Sr. Prabina Rudum, IBVM, professor at Vidhyajothi College of Theology, Delhi, discussed Liquid Fidelity in a Fragmented World: A Reality Check. She highlighted the challenges and impacts of liquid fidelity in modern times and its relevance to consecrated life.

Claretian Frs. Manuel Ezhapparambil, Major Superior of Korea Independent Delegation, Michael Park, Local Superior of Seoul Community, and Fr. James Jose, joined them.

The attendees shared their experiences during the pandemic, evaluated their past activities, and discussed future plans. The meeting ended with the Agape and marked the beginning of a new year of activities for the Lay Claretians, including retreats for the laity in the community and support for other apostolates.

RAISING AWARENESS TO ELIMINATE LEPROSY AS PUBLIC HEALTH THREAT



Bangalore, India. On January 30, Bangalore Province inaugurated a new Leprosy Fortnight program in line with the celebration of World Leprosy Day. Frs. George Kannanthanam and Tomy Urumbumkuzhiyil, CMFF, work at the center. The Leprosy Fortnight program is an important opportunity to raise awareness and mobilize action to eliminate leprosy as a public health threat.

Our Congregation in India, specifically at the Sumanahalli Center in Bangalore, have been working to raise awareness and reduce the stigma associated with leprosy. In 45 years, Sumanahalli has treated over 11,000 persons affected by the disease. About 60 inmates are provided residential care and they reach out to assist nearly 1000 persons. With a focus on mainstreaming persons affected by leprosy, Sumanahalli has developed a program involving education, vocational training, job placement, housing, and marriages. More than 500 cured persons have been employed, and about 300 houses have been built in various parts of Bangalore to rehabilitate them in the community.

CLARET SCHOOLS TYING UP WITH THE LOCAL MEDIA

Portugal-Spain. Some schools in Fatima Province recently had different experiences with the local media respectively. The newspaper *Melhor Escola* of the Colégio Internato dos Carvalhos (CIC) in Portugal, a supplement to the newspaper *O Gaiense*, produced by a team of students from the school, has been on sale since February 4. This project, now in its seventh edition, in collaboration with the newspaper *O Gaiense* and the City Council of V. N. de Gaia, challenges the secondary schools of the municipality to produce a supplement to this newspaper.

The *Melhor Escola* initiative promotes a different way of looking at society and the world in the students who take part: it is an excellent opportunity to exercise active citizenship and be the protagonists of their own education. This is why CIC has been involved in this initiative from the beginning.

Meanwhile, at Claret School of Sevilla in Spain, a film crew from Canal Sur Televisión recorded one of its classes and interviewed pupils and its teacher. The report was broadcast last January 28 on Canal Sur's Espacio Protegido and Andalucía TV.

Then at Claret School of Las Palmas, four 4th year ESO students took part in the day-to-day work of the newspaper Canarias7 as part of the school's 'Work Experience' program. Having chosen the journalism profession, they were invited by the media to live the experience for three days and have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with a journalist's routine. On the other hand, the 2nd year high school students participated in La Buchaca, a podcast focused on economics and financial education broadcast on Canarias Radio.

It was a unique opportunity to get to know a different reality closely while simultaneously experiencing in practice part of the mission of this country. It aimed to offer a practical experience of mission ad gentes.

Schs. Italo Lima, Lucas Salete, Vinícius Caixeta, Lucas Chaves, and Bruno Rafael, CMFF, had the opportunity to live the reality of the families living in the Amazon. Each was sent to different realities: peripheral areas of Manaus, others to the interior of the state of Amazonas, and others to the riverside and indigenous areas.

UPDATES ON THE CLARETIAN MISSION IN MADAGASCAR

Ankarana, Madagascar. In January, the Claretian community of Madagascar discerned the coordinating team and its canonical establishment. After their adaptation period from their arrival in May 2022, the Mission has been canonically established in Ankarana, a pastoral unit with 16 communities forming one parish.

The **Coordinating Team** is now as follows:

Coordinator: Fr. Justin J. Kuzhippalayil, CMF Administrator: Sr. Rani Michael, RMI Secretary: Sr. Helmy Alphonsa, RMI

Each community nucleus has its own Local Government. For the RMI, Sr. Ann Priyathashni, RMI, is the Local Superior, Srs. Rani and Helmy, are the Econome and Secretary, respectively. On the other hand, for the CMF, Fr. Eusebius Toda, CMF is the Local Superior, and Fr. Zbigniew Łaś, CMF, is the Parish Priest.

During the last two weeks of January, some team members have been living in Ankarana, preparing the house: setting up door locking systems, preparing the accessibility to water, looking for the possibility of local resources for the works and the necessary assistance, etc. Then on February 25, the team officially took possession of the parish, Fr. Zbigniew was installed as the new parish priest, and the team is gradually settling in their new residence.

The project began in May 2022 with the arrival of the missionaries in the diocese of Farafangana. For several months, the Claretian Missionaries (CMF) and the Religious of Mary Immaculate Claretian Missionary Sisters (RMI) lived in the diocese's capital to study the local language and get to know the reality. During this time, they have continued to meet in line with the General Governments of both Congregations. They have been visited by their members, Fr. Manuel Tamargo CMF, and Sr. Petronille Mutungidimbu, RMI.
